From May 2001 to April of this year, Jody was an elected member of the Green Party of Washington State Coordinating Council. The first two years she diligently served as Treasurer. During her last term, she served as CC Facilitator. Currently, she holds the position of State Membership Coordinator and Outreach Committee chair for the GPoWS.

In April Jody was re-elected to her third one-year term as GP-US CC delegate representing the great Emerald State. During her three years as a national delegate, she has served as a member of the Floor Rules Working Group, a member of the Annual National Meeting Committee and as an inter-committee liaison to the Presidential Campaign Support Committee.

In learning how to actually live Green on a day-to-day basis, Jody has been involved with both Voluntary Simplicity and Sustainable Seattle since shortly after their inception. Living and sharing her life until recently with her husband of 23 years, the late Bob Haug, they both managed to comfortably and efficiently occupy 400 square feet demonstrating a good life can be experienced by living in accordance with the values of occupying a small footprint and setting a large example.

During these recent times of national stress between the proponents of peace and those of war, Jody organized the Nonviolent Peacekeeper Pool to efficiently connect peacekeepers with training opportunities and the sponsoring organizations of marches and rallies. She served as a buffer for the peaceful demonstrators and worked with law enforcement departments of the Federal Building, Seattle, and other jurisdictions to de-escalate potential misunderstandings during situations that were at times tense.

Jody's a multitasking expert. She's often busy knitting while remaining fully engaged in the organizational meetings with which she's involved. In her spare time, she also gardens, participates in Norwegian folk dancing and makes folk costumes.
