Text of the actual Proposal: As of the date of consensus or successful vote of ther proposal, the right of Carolyn Bninski to participate in the events, activities, internet- and social media-based portals and operations, online or otherwise, of the Green Party of Colorado are hereby revoked. Bninski is ineligible to receive an endorsement or nomination for any elected office or hold any representative position of the GPCO until her rights of participation are restored. Should any

local choose to appoint Bninski to the state council, her participation on any GPCO forum or voting portal will be blocked, and that local should appoint another delegate or forfeit one delegate vote on the state council. Bninski is henceforth declared not in good standing with the Green Party of Colorado, and an active local chapter in good standing may submit a proposal for her reinstatement after a period of three years from the date of ther proposal's ratification. However, the state council officially extends to Bninski an invitation to enter into a restorative justice process, and upon mutually acceptable completion, her rights of participation will be immediately restored.

4. Justification/Goals: Carolyn Bninski is an original signer of the "Restore Green Values" grievance submitted to the GPUS Accreditation Committee on June 14, 2017.

On behalf of the "grievants," Kevin Alumbaugh has articulated that "The CRGV has been in communication with the GPUS Accreditation Committee since June 13th of ther year in regards to one of the only remedies available to us-decertification and rebuilding of the Green Party of Colorado," in an email to the AccredCom on 10/24/17.

Section 2.3 of the Bylaws states, "The Green Party of Colorado (GPCO) is the affiliate of the Green Party of the United States for the State of Colorado." Therefore, because the stated purpose of the "grievance" is to de-affiliate GPCO from the GPUS, Carolyn Bninski's participation and promotion of the grievance is a demonstration of her failure to adhere to the purpose and methods of the GPCO.

Further, Carolyn Bninski's action shows callous disregard for the Key Values of Grassroots Democracy and Decentralization, by usurping the authority of the GPCO state council, by sidestepping longstanding democratic process of submitting a proposal to the council according to established procedures, as the remedy established in the GPCO. The "grievance" also asks for GPUS to remove the democratically-elected officers of the GPCO, as a further demonstration of the disregard for the Key Value of Decentralization.

The GPCO bylaws call out grounds for such a proposal in section 3.3 of the bylaws, "(r)evocation of the rights of participation must be based on failure of the individual to adhere to the purpose and methods of the Green Party of Colorado."

The process for revocation of rights of participation are outlined in the bylaws, Section 3.3.1.

- 3. Text of the actual Proposal: As of the date of consensus or successful vote of this proposal, the right of George "Bill" Bartlett to participate in the events, activities, internet- and social media-based portals and operations, online or otherwise, of the Green Party of Colorado are hereby revoked. Should any local choose to appoint Bill Bartlett to the state council, his participation on any GPCO forum or voting portal will be blocked, and that local should appoint another delegate or forfeit one delegate vote on the state council. Bill Bartlett is henceforth declared not in good standing with the Green Party of Colorado, and an active local chapter in good standing may submit a proposal for his reinstatement after a period of three years from the date of this proposal's

ratification.

4. Justification/Goals: On June 14, 2017, Bill Bartlett unilaterally hijacked the GPCO council forum without authorization from the GPCO state council and was able to do so because the forum was hosted on a server under his ownership and control. He removed democratically-elected officers and web committee members as administrators from the forum, citing non-existing protocols.

Additionally, though Bill Bartlett was not an original signer of the "Restore Green Values" grievance submitted to the GPUS Accreditation Committee on June 14, 2017, he has since become a signer and a primary agitator for this "grievance," publicizing the "grievance" freely through social media and lobbying council members for signatures, often with inflammatory and slanderous rhetoric.

Section 2.3 of the Bylaws states, "The Green Party of Colorado (GPCO) is the affiliate of the Green Party of the United States for the State of Colorado." Therefore, because the stated purpose of the "grievance" is to de-affiliate GPCO from the GPUS, Bartlett's participation and promotion of the grievance is a demonstration of his failure to adhere to the purpose and methods of the GPCO.

Further, Bartlett's action shows callous disregard for the Key Values of Grassroots Democracy and Decentralization, by usurping the authority of the GPCO state council, therefore centralizing power to himself, to assign duties of administration and moderation of the council forum to its officers and to ignore longstanding democratic process of submitting a proposal to the council according to established procedures. The "grievance" also asks for GPUS to remove the democratically-elected officers of the GPCO, as a further demonstration of the disregard for the Key Value of Decentralization.

The GPCO bylaws call out grounds for such a proposal in section 3.3 of the bylaws, "(r)evocation of the rights of participation must be based on failure of the individual to adhere to the purpose and methods of the Green Party of Colorado."

The process for revocation of rights of participation are outlined in the bylaws, Section 3.3.1.

### Susan Hall's 1<sup>st</sup> Notice Email

You are hereby notified that a proposal to revoke you rights of participation in the Green Party of Colorado is being presented to the state council for a vote. Per Section 3.3 of the GPCO Bylaws, "3.3 The right of participation of an individual in the Green Party of Colorado can be revoked by a Green local using its own criteria or by a 75% vote of the members of the state council or state party meeting. Revocation of the rights of participation must be based on failure of the individual to adhere to the purpose and methods of the Green Party of Colorado." The proposal will be in Drafting for two weeks, then be moved to Agreement Seeking for a third week to allow for the full three weeks granted by the bylaws.

Further, Section 3.3.1 of the GPCO Bylaws states: "The Green Party of Colorado affirms the following rights of due process for individuals facing any disciplinary action: The individual must be informed of the potential revocation of their rights of participation at least three weeks (21 days) prior to the vote. The individual will have a chance to speak in their defense at the meeting when the vote is held, either via a written statement or a telephone or web conference with a quorum of state council members. The individual may call witnesses to support their case, and the state council may ask questions of the witness. The individual will receive a written report with the decision with reasons for the decision and the length

of time the disciplinary action will be in effect. Rights of participation will not be automatically reinstated, and a member whose rights of participation have been revoked must file a formal appeal with the Secretary. Rights of participation can be reinstated by an affirmative vote of 75 percent of the state council or by 75 percent of the voting members present at a state meeting."

If you would like to speak in your defense, you are encouraged to do so by means of the official state party forum. We would also be willing to attempt to schedule a phone conference so that you can speak directly to a quorum of the council. Please advise how you would like to proceed.
